Kaltura Media Automatic Captioning



All video and audio content hosted in Florida State University's official video platform, Kaltura Media, will be automatically captioned at a 75% accuracy level beginning August 14, 2017. This represents significant progress in making university video content accessible to a wide variety of users.

Jennifer Koslow, Associate Professor of History, stresses the importance of captioning in the context of accessibility. “First, and most important, we serve a diverse student population,” said Koslow. “Students with hearing disabilities shouldn’t have to ask for special accommodation. We, as a university, should anticipate that need will exist. In addition, the captioning helps all students keep focused as they watch the video. While we, as faculty, are familiar with the terms we are using, some of the terms we use may be new to students. Seeing a word, in addition to hearing it, makes a difference.”

As instructors migrate courses from Blackboard to Canvas or develop new courses in Canvas, now is an ideal time to work on captioning videos. “Automatic captioning gives us the ability to provide a quality textual version of the video,” said John L. Crow of ODL’s Instructional Development Faculty. “It also gives the instructor a good foundation upon which to edit and improve the captions to be as close to 100 percent accurate without starting from scratch, thus making the captions meet the current universal design and accessibility standards.”

For instructors who wish to edit automatic captions for more accurate readability, ODL has produced easy-to-follow tutorials for both learning management systems ([Blackboard](#) | [Canvas](#)). State Authorization Update

Florida State University is making progress toward becoming authorized to offer distance learning to all states outside of Florida.

Florida is pursuing membership in the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements ([NC-SARA](#)), which will allow the state to offer educational opportunities in other states. Such opportunities include marketing and recruiting for face-to-face and distance learning courses, as well as engaging in education-related activities such as recruiting potential students at college fairs or engaging in clinical placements in other states.

“We have diligently tracked the progress of the NC-SARA legislation throughout the year and anxiously anticipate being able to resume educational activities in key states such as Georgia and New York,” said Kristin Carlton, Assistant Director of Academic Programs for ODL.

The Florida Department of Education is currently establishing the portal that will process NC-SARA applications from Florida institutions. While no timelines are currently available, ODL is hopeful that the portal will be in place and the application process outlined by Fall 2018.

Tool: Cidi Design Tools

What is it? Design Tools is software that integrates with Canvas to allow instructors to develop and style course content.

How does it help? Design Tools helps instructors quickly create high-quality courses with consistent design that meet accessibility and universal design standards.

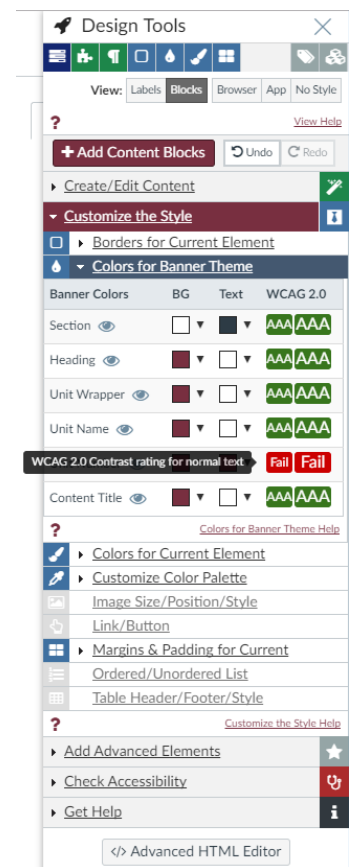

As you build courses in Canvas, Cidi Design Tools can help with course development, page design, and content organization. The Design Tools environment provides more than a dozen prebuilt course templates, focusing on the home, syllabus, and module overview pages. Design Tools features the Multi-Tool, which helps with quickly building course architecture. By using both the templates and the Multi-Tool, instructors can create high-quality courses with consistent design.

“I’ve worked with dozens of departments on campus to help them create their own templates that can be shared in the Canvas Commons and then downloaded and used as a starting place for other departmental courses,” said John Braswell of ODL’s Instructional Development Faculty. “This has allowed departments to develop branding and consistency that was simply not possible with Blackboard. The quality of the courses designed with the Design Tools templates are superior to the legacy Blackboard courses that they are replacing.”

Lisa Tripp, Associate Teaching Professor in the College of Motion Picture Arts, agrees that the tool aids in course quality. “Design Tools has been helpful for developing Canvas pages for my courses that have a consistent look and feel,” she said. “I’ve used Design Tools to create templates for my syllabi, module overviews, and assignment instructions. I like the fact that, relatively easily and without much knowledge of HTML, I can have decent-looking pages that are mobile-friendly and meet accessibility standards.”

With Design Tools, instructors can quickly and easily add customized content to a page. “Before Design Tools, I had to use the HTML editor for special content display on a page,” said Liying Miao of ODL’s Instructional Development Faculty. “Now, I can add tabs to divide my content into categories, add an Important Note, or add content blocks such as objectives and teacher/TA information in a matter of seconds. I encourage instructors to [attend the 90-minute training](#), which will save time on designing a quality course, giving them a great return on investment.”
